Overview of IOA Work

The Institute endeavors to articulate ageing topics to different sectors of the community. Various channels were used including conferences to address subjects on intrinsic capacity in ageing and biogerontology, seminar to engage discussions with academic and former senior government officials on research findings, radio interviews and newspaper articles to share age-friendly messages and end-of-life care issues.







■ The network of elders, Network of Ageing Well for All (NAWA) (耆萃匯), continues to grow in terms of membership and activities. In addition to a spectrum of activities from exercise to planting aiming to enhance the physical & mental wellbeing of elders, the Institute has organised a day camp for NAWA members to enjoy the CUHK campus and cultural spots.








The Institute's work fosters closer engagement with the CUHK community. Its researches and activities contributed to the University's initiative of Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) Hong Kong Chapter. As a partner to the U-STEMist Scheme, staff of the Institute provided guidance and advice to university students to work on elderly projects. Various projects of the Institute also provided opportunities for students to obtain first-hand experience and interaction with elders such as through writing life story books for elders and pairing up with elders to conduct place audit for the Ma On Shan community.



Research and Academic Activities



 Centering on ageing well, the Institute places its research focus areas on the individual and interactive effects of personal factors, physical environment and social environment on ageing. The overarching framework guides the research work of the Institute, with details at Annex of the report.

The Institute has initiated / collaborated with other units to bid for Theme-based Research and Collaborative Research Fund. Its interdisciplinary approach to conduct researches on ageing management such as ageing-well indicators, physical and physiological well-being and age-friendly environment align with the research strategic themes under the University's Strategic Plan 2016-2020. With funding support from the Vice-Chancellor's Discretionary Fund, the Institute continued with its research work on projects involving staff from medicine, social science and engineering faculties.

Project Developments



Age-friendly City



This is the first year in which the scores of the Hong Kong Elder Quality of Life Index were available since its inception. With indicators to measure age-friendliness of cities incorporated, the Index enables capturing important local determinants of wellbeing among Hong Kong elders, monitor and evaluate local age-friendly interventions and improve quality of life and wellbeing of elders through stimulating debates and providing policymakers with a reference tool.



The Institute has supported 15 district programmes with more than 4,410 elder beneficiaries covering 7 age-friendly city domains. In addition, the Institute initiated the Active Ageing Programme to empower older adults in Kwai Tsing, North and Sai Kung districts to develop a healthy lifestyle and voice opinions on communal amenities for active ageing. In the programme, outdoor exercises and place audit on the public amenities enabled elders to voice out their views through videos and exhibitions shown in the Information Day.

To arouse public awareness on age-friendly city, the Institute held a public forum on Age-friendly Community Support and Health Services in November 2017. Over 500 participants from government, academia, professional bodies, elderly groups, social and medical sectors and the general public participated in the forum serving as a platform to brainstorm ideas on how to improve and implement our community support and health services.

















End-of-Life Care

Training to healthcare staff on end-of-life (EOL) care topics such as serious illness conversations and medical ethics was conducted in hospital and residential care home for the elderly in the New Territories East Cluster. The topic was also featured in other context to raise awareness of the practitioners in the field such as Hospital Authority Convention and Hong Kong Doctors' Union.

Concerted efforts were made to promote and educate the public through workshops, talks and publications. Two public events on EOL care were held in August 2017 and March 2018 to share with some 540 participants on topics such as Advance Care Planning (ACP) and Advance Directive, communication skills with healthcare professionals, and making a will, followed by smaller group interactive workshops. An ACP handbook and a book on Good Death (吾該好死) were produced and disseminated to the public and staff in social service sector.





Primary Health Care

The Institute continued to implement a model of primary care to fulfil the unmet needs of older people in Hong Kong along the Integrated Care for Older People (ICOPE) model advocated by the World Health Organization. The use of information technology was piloted and incorporated to serve as an automated system to empower older people for their self-management.





As interim project evaluation has been completed with report sent to the Hong Kong Jockey Club in June 2018.



Healthcare Empowerment Training

A lot of the frail elders are coping with one or more of the following chronic health conditions such as heart conditions, pneumonia, dementia, delirium, incontinence, frequent falls which may end up in fractures, depression, weight loss, sleep problems, and thinner skin which can lead to tears or wounds that heal very slowly. The list of chronic health conditions in their care can seem overwhelming. However, with proper care and support, our frail elders can still lead a life filled with joy and dignity.

There are a lot to consider when it comes to health problems of frail elders, and deciding where to start can be challenging. In order to fit in with the new communication era, the Programme, supported by the CUHK Jockey Club Institute of Ageing, will be developed as Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) and micro modules. Understanding health problems of older people can be demanding, but we try to narrow it down to the essentials. The training mode will be scenario-based, with interactive online training material. CADENZA training material will serve as a base, and will be enhanced with the latest development of care to the elders. The Programme is open to anyone, but will be of particular relevance to professionals and caregivers who are involved in caring older persons with common health problems. Both MOOC and micro modules will be set up at a dedicated website and a mobile app. Caregivers can then update their knowledge with their mobile devices anywhere at any time.
